We made the Earth a member of our congregation seven years ago.

Received a Green Oscar for Advocacy from California Interfaith Power and Light (2011)

We added 90 solar panels 5 years ago.

Read over 20,000 pages on eco-theology, ecology and climate change, and eco-biblical hermeneutics. I am working on green theology book.

Participation in climate street theater (die-in) at the LA Federal Building with an interfaith clergy group and arrest action.

Pressuring the LA Department of Power and Water to streamline its process of hooking up residents, businesses, and non-profits to the electric grid.

Designed an 8 week online course for introducing UCC churches to "greening their church and spirituality" To be launched in Fall 2014.

Greening our Campus

Tankless Water Heater

Replacement of all Toilets with High Efficiency Low flush Toilets, saving an average of 3500 gallons of water per year

Replacement of flushing urinals with Eco-Blue urinals saving 1500 gallons per year.

Recycle paper, plastics, bottles. Reduce paper and replace as much as possible through electronic media.

Replacement of all lights with CFLs and LEDs wherever possible.

Composting of food and garden cuttings

Water harvesting with rain barrels. We also capture the condensation from air conditioning for watering (Two 50 gallon water barrels filled every two weeks in the summer months) of our garden during the summer months.

Created an urban meditation garden with donated plants and climate appropriate plants. In addition, we set up communal plots for folks to garden vegetables. All plants have been donated.

Introduction of water conservation program for church and educational forum.

Community Advocacy Programs:

Periodic Solar Nights for faith communities, businesses and home owners. An evening on tax credits for energy efficiency retrofits for residences. We also have a series of vendors offering programs for sales or leasing/buying options for solar panels.
